Submissions

Manuscript files must be sent to the Director at albertomanco@unior.it. in Microsoft Word and in PDF formats. Fonts must be embedded in the PDF version.

Papers must include an Abstract (500 characters limit spaces included) and 3/5 keywords. To ensure double blind reviewing, authors are to submit an anonymous as well as a non-anonymous copy of the same paper. The anonymous version has to be void of any and all personal references to author/s.

The non-anonymous copy must indicate the author's full name and surname, affiliation (university, both postal and e-mail address) as well as references, in the first note, to any official research (grants, acknowledgements, funding information).

Moreover, it must be submitted along with a "Copyright Transfer Agreement" available for download at www.aionlinguistica.com.

Authors are kindly asked to submit manuscripts whose total count exceeds not 30.000 strokes (characters, spaces and bibliography included).

Text must be single-spaced and divided into numbered paragraphs using Arabic numerals.

Font Palatino Linotype, pt 10. For Ancient Greek, please use the Greek font family. Except for special purposes, authors are asked to refrain from using other font types. In instances of special purposes, fonts have to be attached separately in the email. For phonetic symbols, authors ought to use the SILDoulosIPA font.

Manuscripts must use fonts that are pre-defined and traceable. We do not accept papers using author's self-made fonts.

Short quotations must be enclosed in double quotation marks.

Block quotations exceeding 3 lines must be typed as a separate paragraph (single-spaced, pt 9, with left and right indentation set at 1 cm). No quotation marks.

Footnotes are to be typed (pt 8) on each page; footnote numbers in the text must always

precede the closing punctuation mark¹. Footnotes must follow the Arabic numeral sequence.

Except for special purposes, authors are to avoid: capital letters, bold and underlining.

Bibliographical references in-text must follow the Author-date system, e.g.: (Verdi 2000, 55-56).

Images/charts/tables must be centred (10 cm width limit) and captions fitted under each one.

Tables may be placed as an appendix to the text if this makes them easier to read.

Hyperlinks must be inactive, in black ink and not underlined.

Page numbers will be added later, thus avoid footers or headers.
